

Miniature Schnauzer Puppy Growth Rate Chart

At birth, the Miniature Schnauzer weighs between 4 to 9 ounces and is about 3 to 7 inches long.

During the first 2 weeks, the puppies will double their birth weight. At one month Mini Schnauzer puppies weigh anywhere from 1 ½ to 2 ½ pounds.



By 2 months, puppies will have doubled their size yet again, weighing in at 3 to 5 pounds.

At 16 weeks, your Schnauzer puppy's weight is about half of what his actual adult size will be (+ up to 5 more pounds). The calculation is simple: 2 x body weight at 4 months.

At 4 months, Miniature Schnauzer SAMSON weighs in at 7 pounds 4 oz. and is 7 inches tall (feet to shoulder). Will he be around 14 pounds full grown?



At 6 months, your Miniature Schnauzer has reached 75% - 85% of what his full-grown weight will be.

SAMSON at 6 months weighs 11 pounds.



Over the next several months, your Miniature Schnauzer will only gain another few pounds, as his growth rate begins to slow down until he reaches his full size.

Between 8 to 10 months Miniature Schnauzer SAMSON weighs in between 12 and 13 pounds.



At 1 year, Miniature Schnauzer SAMSON is 13.5 pounds and 13 inches tall. Although he is now full-grown he will still add a bit of weight filling out a bit more.



At 2 years old, Miniature Schnauzer SAMSON stands 13 inches tall from feet to shoulder and weighs in at 16 pounds. His vet said that was a bit too heavy so we had began monitoring more closely the amount of daily treats he was given and today he is at the appropriate weight of 14.5 pounds.

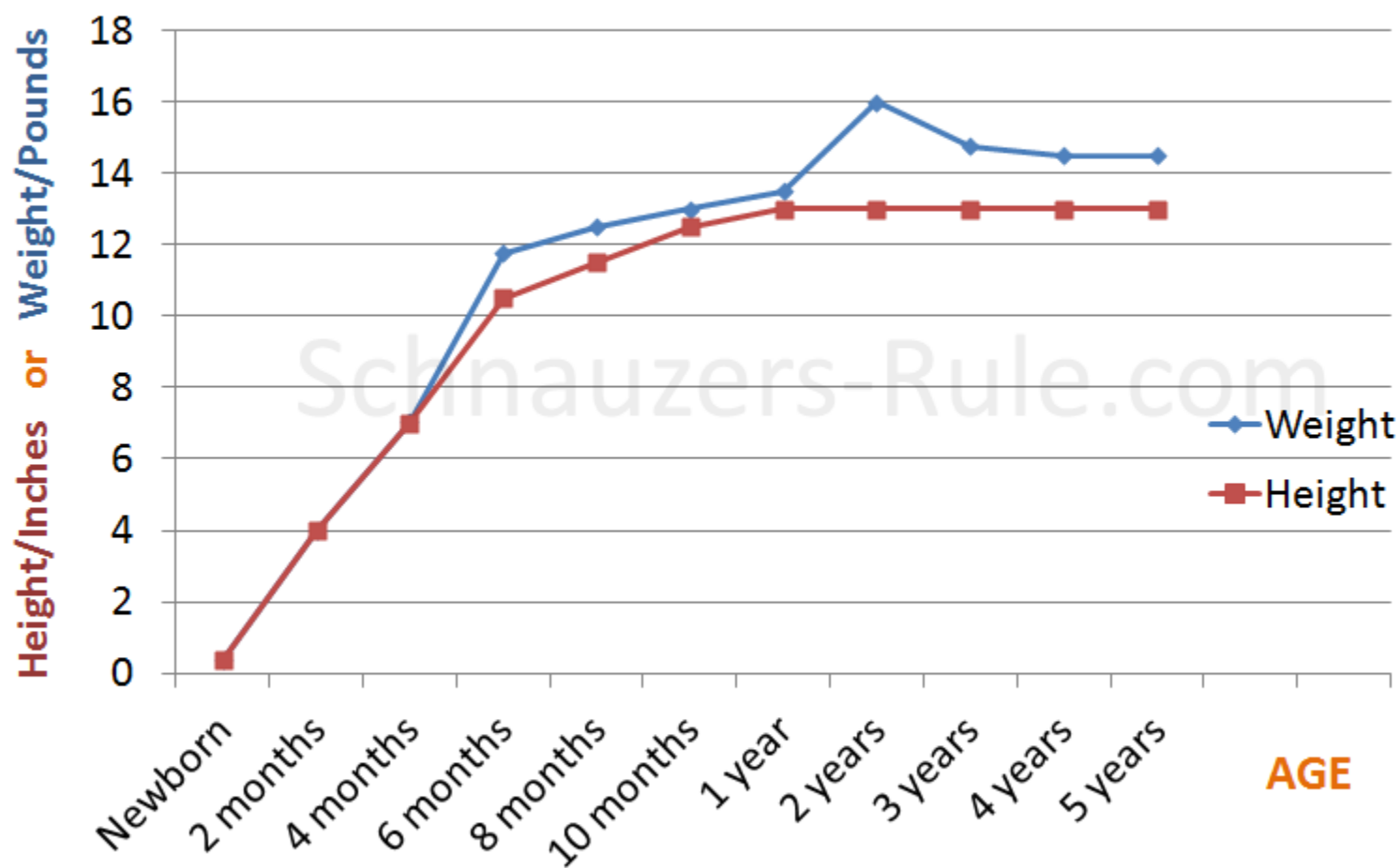


Today SAMSON still weighs 14.5 pounds. Photo of 8 year Mini Schnauzer SAMSON

Looking back on the Schnauzer puppy weight calculation on slide 3... SAMSON weighed 7.25 pounds...

$$2 \times 7.25 \text{ pounds} = 14.5 \text{ pounds}$$
